AIMS of the SAM Project:

- Foster interregional academic cooperation between universities through academic mobility
- Enhance people-to-people exchange and cultural dialogue between young Ukrainians
- Allow such mobility to be organized and formally recognized as a part of a student's degree programme

IMPACTS:

- At local level: implementation of global competences to the general educational requirements, including the mastering of economic sciences, understanding the actual problems of Ukraine's regions and local challenges.
- At regional level will be development and implementation of programs of cultural competence training, open to all interested employees of the University graduates.
- At national level: creating of opportunities for cross-regional communication in non-academic activities,
- tolerant interaction of students and teachers
- rapid integration of visiting students into the academic environment of the University and the city in general;
- encouraging and supporting young people and researchers in practicing professional skills in specific contexts in highly competitive and dynamic environment;
- launching of business platform for future entrepreneurs (KNEU and PUET alumni).

Terms & Conditions:

- Students will be fully engaged in academic course-work during their mobility periods with an 8-week mobility period no less than **12 ECTS credits**
- Number of students will be **12** from each University.
- can easily **join the hosting small groups as a group**, or
- can **be separated to different academic groups** (the best scenario from the cross-cultural and communication point of view)
- can be **a separate guest group** (this is the least preferable variant but it is also real and working, as the least amount of students to be a group is 12 according to common practice).

The IROs of PUET & KNEU
carry out the control and ensuring

KNEU:

WHY “... Management” 5th semester?

- The curricular of the 5th semester in PUET and KNEU are the most similar if compared with other semesters. The 3 compulsory disciplines of PUET curricular (Foreign Language, Entrepreneurship, Self-Management and Time-Management) are relevant to the following KNEU disciplines: Foreign Language, Corporate Entrepreneurship and Personnel Management and vice versa.
- The PUET’s “World Economics and International Relations” may be completed in terms of other Bachelor programs of KNEU.

Selection in KNEU:

- An applicant submits to CIAM's coordinator:
- Transcript of Academic Record with an Average grade on a scale of 100;
- Motivation letter (in Ukrainian and in English);
- CV (Europass format, in English and in Ukrainian)

CIAM provides support in translation of all the documents of the winners for the SAM administration.

- Then the Expert Group evaluates the applications and nominates the selected applicants.

Selection in PUET:

- An applicant submits to ISEC's coordinator:
 - Transcript of Academic Record with an Average grade on a scale of 100;
 - Motivation letter (in Ukrainian and in English);
 - CV (Europass format, in English and in Ukrainian);
 - Recommendation letter from one of the lecturers
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- Then the Selection Committee evaluates the applications and nominates the selected applicants.

For KNEU Students in PUET:

- The academic year in PUET starts in October and lasts 13 weeks.
- KNEU students come there at the beginning of the second study week and will spend the $\frac{2}{3}$ of semester in PUET.
- The selected courses will be held either for mixed groups (PUET with integrated KNEU students) or just for 12 KNEU students in a way to have **all classes completed during the project time**, that is during 8 weeks.
- At the end students will have a final control (exam or credit) and get credits for the courses completed.
- The only difference will be that they will have courses in a more intensive way (8 weeks instead of 13).
- In such a way they will get 12 credits for 3 disciplines which are almost the same (Foreign Language, Entrepreneurship and Self and Time Management) and 1 (World Economics and International Relations) which will be recognized as an optional though KNEU students have it in the following semester.
- They will get a Transcript of Records with credits received and these credits will be completely recognized in KNEU.
- Moreover, students will also be recommended to attend the optional courses of Ethic Management and Philosophy in order to get an idea of the usual (not intensive) way of studying in PUET.

For PUET Students in KNEU:

- As the academic year in KNEU starts in the beginning of September, PUET students coming from October 06 will join the study process which have started already.
- The usual duration of semester in KNEU is 17-18 weeks so PUET students will join the class and leave the class before the exams start (the session takes place in January in KNEU).
- PUET students will attend all the disciplines provided according to the curriculum (first of all the ones which correspond their home plan most of all (Foreign Language, Corporate Entrepreneurship, Personnel Management, Economic Forecasting) and the rest ones: Management, Public Administration, Commercial Law).
- They will get 50% of credits for the four subjects that are almost the same in PUET and KNEU and these results will be added to their home institution program (e.g. it will be considered a maximum score for auditorium work and an access for exam (“dopusk” in Ukrainian)
- The points PUET students get in Management, Public Administration and Commercial Law will be transformed to credits (2 of 5 or 2 of 4 accordingly) and indicated in the Certificate of Participation together with the amount of hours and credits they get during the 8 weeks mobility period.

Non-academic activities:

KNEU:

E.g.

- championships in chess and draughts
- table tennis
- rehearsals and trainings for music contests etc.

PUET:

E.g.

- competitions in different kinds of sports
- volleyball tournament
- table tennis
- rehearsals and trainings for music contests and concerts etc.

Extracurricular activities: KYIV

- Week 1 Ice-breaking Party, KNEU campus trip, Kyiv City Tour
- Week 2 Museum of KNEU, Event to celebrate Day of Ukrainian Cossacks (venue and time TBC)
- Week 3 Visit to The Employment Promotion Center “Perspectives” (KNEU) and KPMG office (TBC)
- Week 4 Parks of Kyiv, Museum “03 a.m.”, Open Lecture (Time Management)

The stages of the Programme with the suggested timeline:

- Inter-institutional agreement signed – before the end of July 2020
- Learning Agreements signed - before the end of July 2020
- Contracts with the British Council signed, and first payments made – July-August 2020
- **PUET – KNEU mobility October 12 – December 06**
- Final reports – January 2021
